Geneva, 12 June 2025 - The ninth edition of the modern and contemporary art fair, organized under the High Patronage of H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco, will take place on 8 and 9 July 2025 at the Grimaldi Forum. A Press & VIP Preview will be held on Monday, July 7, coinciding with the opening of the exhibition *Colours: Masterpieces from the Centre Pompidou*, also on view at the Grimaldi Forum.

Under the direction of Charlotte Diwan, the fair continues to pursue its mission: to offer Monaco a refined and international art market event, with a program specifically tailored to collectors in the region.

The Architecture of the Centre Pompidou, 1971–2030 Pierre Yovanovitch Mobilier Sigg Art Foundation

A collaboration with the Centre Pompidou

The Centre Pompidou will present a booth dedicated to the architecture of the museum, showcasing the story of this iconic building through archival drawings, previously unseen documents, and a model of its upcoming transformation for 2030. A roundtable will accompany the presentation on Tuesday, July 8 at 3:30 PM.

The fair will coincide with the opening of the exhibition "Colours: Masterpieces from the Centre Pompidou", curated by Didier Ottinger and on view at the Grimaldi Forum from 7 July. Echoing this major exhibition, a dedicated booth will be presented within the fair in collaboration with the Centre Pompidou, bringing together works proposed by participating galleries around the theme of colour.

Guest Designer: Pierre Yovanovitch

The programme will be further enriched by a series of special projects, including a focus on interior design led by renowned designer Pierre Yovanovitch, the invited guest designer of the 2025 edition. His project will occupy a 60 m² space at the heart of the fair, incorporating artworks selected from participating galleries.

Piaget, artisan and artist of time

Conversation with Mr. Yves Piaget moderated by Jean-Bernard Forot, Head of Patrimony at Piaget. In this conversation, Yves Piaget reflects on the creative vision of a Maison that, in the 1960s, was a pioneer in blending watchmaking and jewelry, infusing artistic expression into its craftsmanship. He reveals how this boldness attracted some of the greatest artists of the time, paving the way for unique collaborations. Finally, Mr. Yves Piaget shares how the vibrant energy emanating from this craftsmanship helped shape a refined art of living, shared with clients and friends—a creative force that bridges life and art.

Khao Yai Art Forest and Bangkok Kunsthalle, a new art paradigm from Southeast Asia

With Amal Khalaf (Co-curator of Sharjah Biennial 16 and Ghost, video and performance art festival in Bangkok), Stefano Rabolli Pansera (Architect, Curator and Director of Khao Yai Art Forest and Bangkok Kunsthalle), and in the presence of Marisa Chearavanont (Philanthropist, Collector, Founder of Khao Yai Art Co. The lecture explores the methodology and vision behind two institutions that, through the notion of healing, propose a new paradigm for the art institution—one rooted in both natural and urban contexts.
